HARC grant project underway

One of the stated purposes of Historic Wrightsville Inc. is to encourage and preserve the historic memorabilia of our community. As such, the museum becomes a repository for original historical records, including ledgers, maps, documents and photographs.

Currently, stored in cardboard boxes or in plastic tubs, are five collections from Wrightsville Borough, Fairview Cemetery Association, Wrightsville Building and Loan, Wrightsville Schools and Weitzel's store. As stewards of these collections, we will be sorting; removing paper, clips, rubber bands, string ties; dusting; identifying, cataloging and archivally storing 160 pounds of documents and record books.

Once archived, recorded and properly stored, conservation of some items may be deemed necessary and funds for their preservation will be sought.

Saving these historical records of Wrightsville's development from ferry town to manufacturing and transportation hub to rural community of 2300 to blossoming tourism and historical center, remains the goal of Historic Wrightsville, Inc.

As part of this project, we are also eagerly anticipating the assistance of an intern from York College's Public History degree program. This partnership with York College will expand our training in theory and methods of conserving and exhibiting public history.

The primary outcome of this project will be the preservation of five collections, but the secondary outcome will be enriched collections for the community, in new exhibits and public events.
